Operation Christmas Child - 2025

"Let my heart be broken with the things that break the heart of God." Bob Pierce wrote those words after visiting suffering children in Korea. This led him to found Samaritan's Purse in 1970. The mission of this organization was to "meet emergency needs in crisis areas through existing evangelical mission agencies and national churches". When Pierce died in 1978, Franklin Graham became president of Samaritan's Purse and he has continued the mission of Bob Pierce by leading the ministry through hurricanes, earthquakes, wars, and famine around the world, following the Biblical example of the Good Samaritan.

In 1993, Graham started a ministry called "Operation Christmas Child" to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way to suffering or needy children around the world. By filling a simple shoe box with gifts for needy children, Operation Christmas Child has communicated to children around the world what the angel said to the shepherds about Jesus 'birth, "I bring you news of great joy that will be for all the people". (Luke 2:10). Since 1993, 220 million children in more than 170 countries and territories have received shoeboxes filled with toys, school supplies, hygiene items and a gospel message. The project delivers not only the joy of what, for many children, is their first gift ever, it also gives them a tangible expression of God's love. Shoebox gifts are collected by faithful partners around the world including the U.S., Canada, Europe, Australia, New Zealand, South Korea, Spain, Finland, and the United Kingdom and delivered to children wherever Samaritan's Purse has identified need.

Again this year, we will be participating in Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Ministry. Shoeboxes will be available this month in the narthex with thorough directions on how to build and fill your shoebox. A list of suggested items will be on your shoebox label that you will pick up with your shoebox. It also will include items not to be packed in your box, such as food, candy, liquids, lotions, medications, glass items, etc. It is not too early to get started filling your shoeboxes!

A \$10.00 donation to cover the cost of shipping can be packed in your box in cash or check made out to Samaritan's Purse.

Last year we delivered 85 shoeboxes to our deliver site, E-Free Church in Gaylord. Our goal this year is 100! I know we can do it!! The deadline for dropping off your shoebox at the church is Sunday, November 16. However, you can bring your shoeboxes back to church anytime you have them completed. It is fun to watch the number of boxes grow over the next few months. Feel free to take as many boxes as you want. Give them to friends and family to fill as well.

Thank you for your participation in this ministry for children in need. Our church may be small in number, but we have proven to have very big hearts!
